4	"(a)	Authorization.—From amounts made avail-
5	able to ca	arry out this part, the Secretary is authorized to
6	award gr	cants or contracts to local educational agencies
7	and com	munity-based organizations to pay the Federal
8	share of	the costs of initiating, expanding, and improving
9	physical	education programs (including after-school pro-
10	grams) f	or students in kindergarten through grade 12,
11	by—	
12		"(1) providing materials and support to enable
13	stud	ents to participate actively in physical education
14	activ	vities; and
15		``(2) providing funds for staff and teacher

18	"(b)	Program Elements.—A physical education

4	DENTS.—An application for a grant or contract under this
5	part may provide for the participation, in the activities

8	mentary schools or secondary schools, and their par-
9	ents and teachers; or
10	"(2) home-schooled students, and their parents
11	and teachers.
12	"SEC. 4304. REQUIREMENTS.
13	"(a) Annual Report to the Secretary.—In
14	order to continue receiving funding after the first year of
15	a multiyear grant or contract under this part, the adminis-
16	trator of the grant or contract for the local educational
17	agency or community-based organization shall submit to
18	the Secretary an annual report that—
19	"(1) describes the activities conducted during
20	the preceding year; and
21	"(2) demonstrates that progress has been made
22	toward meeting State standards for physical edu-
23	cation.
