4	MENTS.
5	"(a) Grant Program Authorized.—From funds
6	made available to carry out this subpart, the Secretary
7	shall award, on a competitive basis, grants to State edu-
8	cational agencies that have submitted applications at such
9	time, in such manner, and containing such information as
0	the Secretary may reasonably require, which demonstrate

to the satisfaction of the Secretary, that the requirements of this section will be met, for one of more of the following: 2 3 "(1) Allowing for collaboration with institutions 4 of higher education, other research institutions, or 5 other organizations to improve the quality, validity, 6 and reliability of State academic assessments beyond 7 the requirements for such assessments described in 8 section 1111(b)(2). 9 "(2) Developing or improving assessments for 10 students who are children with disabilities, including 11 using the principles of universal design for learning, 12 which may include developing assessments aligned to 13 alternate academic achievement standards for stu-14 dents with the most significant cognitive disabilities described in section 1111(b)(2)(D). 15 "(3) Measuring student progress or academic 16 17 growth over time, including by using multiple meas-18 ures. 19 "(4) To evaluate student academic achievement 20 through the development of comprehensive academic 21 assessment instruments, such as performance and 22 technology-based academic assessments that empha-23 size the mastery of standards and aligned com-24 petencies in a competency-based education model, 25 technology-based academic assessments, computer

3	"(b) Annual Report.—Each State educational
4	agency receiving a grant under this section shall submit
5	an annual report to the Secretary describing its activities
6	under the grant and the result of such activities.
7	"(c) Prohibition.—No funds provided under this
8	section to the Secretary shall be used to mandate, direct,
9	control, incentivize, or make financial awards conditioned
10	upon States (or a consortia of States) developing any as-
11	sessment common to a number of States, including testing
12	activities prohibited under section 9529.
13	"SEC. 1203. AUDITS OF ASSESSMENT SYSTEMS.
14	"(a) In General.—From the amount reserved
15	under section 1204(b)(1)(C) for a fiscal year, the Sec-
16	retary shall make grants, from allotments under sub-
17	section (b), to States to enable the States to—
18	"(1) in the case of a grant awarded under this
19	section to a State for the first time—
20	"(A) carry out audits of State assessment
21	systems and ensure that local educational agen-
22	cies carry out audits of local assessments under
23	subsection (e)(1);
24	"(B) prepare and carry out the State plan
25	under subsection (e)(6); and

1	"(C) award subgrants under subsection (f);
2	and
3	"(2) in the case of a grant awarded under this
4	section to a State that has previously received a
5	grant under this section—
6	"(A) carry out the State plan under sub-
7	section (e)(6); and

10	"(b) MINIMUM AMOUNT.—Each State with an ap-
11	proved application shall receive a grant amount of not less
12	than \$1,500,000 per fiscal year.
13	"(c) REALLOCATION.—If a State chooses not to apply
14	to receive a grant under this subsection, or if such State's
15	application under subsection (d) is disapproved by the Sec-
16	retary, the Secretary shall reallocate such grant amount
17	to other States with approved applications.
18	"(d) Application.—A State desiring to receive a
19	grant under this section shall submit an application to the
20	Secretary at such time, in such manner, and containing
21	such information as the Secretary may require.

2	year after a State receives a grant under this section
3	for the first time, the State shall—
4	"(A) conduct an audit of the State assess-
5	ment system;
6	"(B) ensure that each local educational
7	agency under the State's jurisdiction and re-
8	ceiving funds under this Act—
9	"(i) conduct an audit of each local as-
.0	sessment administered by the local edu-
.1	cational agency; and
.2	"(ii) submits the results of such audit
.3	to the State; and
.4	"(C) report the results of each State and
.5	local educational agency audit conducted under
6	subparagraphs (A) and (B), in a format that

12	"(B) whether the assessment is required
13	under section 1111(b)(2) or allowed under sec-
14	tion $1111(b)(2)(D)$;
15	"(C) the annual cost to the State edu-
16	cational agency involved in developing, pur-
17	chasing, administering, and scoring the assess-
18	ment;
19	"(D) the purpose for which the assessment
20	was designed and the purpose for which the as-
21	sessment is used, including assessments de-
22	signed to contribute to systems of improvement
23	of teaching and learning;
24	"(E) the time for disseminating assess-
25	ment results;

2	is aligned with the challenging State academic

4	"(4) Local assessment description.—Ar
5	audit of a local assessment conducted under para-
6	graph (1) shall include a description of the local as-
7	sessment carried out by the local educational agency
8	including—
9	"(A) the descriptions listed in subpara-
20	graphs (A), (D), and (E) of paragraph (3);
21	"(B) the annual cost to the local edu-
22	cational agency of developing, purchasing, ad-
23	ministering, and scoring the assessment;

1	"(C) the extent to which the assessment is
2	aligned to the challenging State academic
3	standards under section 1111(b)(1);
4	"(D) a description of any State or local
5	law or regulation that establishes the require-
6	ment for the assessment; and
7	"(E) in the case of a summative assess-
8	ment that is used for accountability purposes,
9	whether the assessment is valid and reliable and
10	consistent with nationally recognized profes-
11	sional and technical standards.
12	"(5) STAKEHOLDER FEEDBACK.—Each audit of
13	a State assessment system or local assessment sys-
14	tem conducted under subparagraph (A) or (B) of
15	paragraph (1) shall include feedback on such system
16	from education stakeholders, which shall cover infor-
17	mation such as—
18	"(A) how educators, school leaders, and
19	administrators use assessment data to improve
20	and differentiate instruction;
21	"(B) the timing of release of assessment
22	data;
23	"(C) the extent to which assessment data
24	is presented in an accessible and understand-
25	able format for educators, school leaders, par-

1	ents, students (if appropriate), and the commu-
2	nity;
3	"(D) the opportunities, resources, and
4	training educators and administrators are given
5	to review assessment results and make effective
6	use of assessment data;
7	"(E) the distribution of technological re-
8	sources and personnel necessary to administer
9	assessments;
10	"(F) the amount of time educators spend
11	on assessment preparation;
12	"(G) the assessments that administrators,
13	educators, parents, and students, if appropriate,
14	do and do not find useful;
15	"(H) the amount of time students spend
16	taking the assessments; and
17	"(I) other information as appropriate.
18	"(6) State plan on audit findings.—
19	"(A) PREPARING THE STATE PLAN.—Not
20	later than 6 months after a State conducts an
21	audit under paragraph (1) and based on the re-
22	sults of such audit, the State shall, in coordina-
23	tion with the local educational agencies under
24	the jurisdiction of the State, prepare and sub-
25	mit to the Secretary, a plan to improve and

0	"(iv) disseminating the assessment
1	data in an accessible and understandable

14	"(v) decreasing time between admin-
15	istering such State assessments and releas-
16	ing assessment data.
17	"(B) CARRY OUT THE STATE PLAN.—A
18	State shall carry out a State plan as soon as
19	practicable after the State prepares such State
20	plan under subparagraph (A) and during each
21	grant period of a grant described in subsection
22	(a)(2) that is awarded to the State.
23	"(f) Subgrants to Local Educational Agen-
24	CIES.—

1	"(1) IN GENERAL.—From the amount awarded
2	to a State under this section, the State shall reserve
3	not less than 20 percent of funds to make subgrants
4	to local educational agencies in the State, or con-
5	sortia of such local educational agencies, based or
6	demonstrated need in the agency's or consortium's
7	application to improve assessment quality, use, and
8	alignment with the State's challenging academic
9	standards under section 1111(b)(1).
.0	"(2) Local educational agency applica-
1	TION.—Each local educational agency, or consortium
2	of local educational agencies, seeking a subgrant
3	under this subsection shall submit an application to
4	the State at such time, in such manner, and con-
.5	taining such other information as determined by the
.6	State. The application shall include a description of
.7	the agency's or consortium's needs to improve as-
.8	sessment quality, use, and alignment (as described
.9	in paragraph (1)).
20	"(3) Use of funds.—A subgrant awarded
21	under this subsection to a local educational agency
22	or consortium of such agencies may be used to—
23	"(A) conduct an audit of local assessments
4	under subsection (e)(1)(B);

1	"(B) eliminate any assessments identified
2	for elimination by such audit, such as by buying
3	out the remainder of procurement contracts
4	with assessment developers;
5	"(C) disseminate the best practices de-
6	scribed in subsection (e)(6)(A)(ii);
7	"(D) improve the capacity of school leaders
8	and educators to disseminate assessment data
9	in an accessible and understandable format for
10	parents and families, including for children with
11	disabilities or English learners;
12	"(E) improve assessment delivery systems
13	and schedules, including by increasing access to
14	technology and exam proctors, where appro-
15	priate;
16	"(F) hire instructional coaches, or promote
17	educators who may receive increased compensa-
18	tion to serve as instructional coaches, to sup-
19	port educators to develop classroom-based as-
20	sessments, interpret assessment data, and de-
21	sign instruction; and
22	"(G) provide for appropriate accommoda-
23	tions to maximize inclusion of children with dis-
24	abilities and English learners participating in
25	assessments.

1	"(g) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
2	"(1) LOCAL ASSESSMENT.—The term 'local as-
3	sessment' means an academic assessment carried out
4	by a local educational agency that is separate from
5	an assessment required by section 1111(b)(3).
6	"(2) State.—The term 'State' means each of
7	the 50 States, the District of Columbia, and the
8	Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.
9	Beginning on page 170, strike line 6 and all that fol-

1	"SEC. 1204. FUNDING.
2	"(a) National Assessment of Educational
.3	PROGRESS.—For the purpose of administering the State
4	assessments under the National Assessment of Edu-
.5	cational Progress, there are authorized to be appropriated
6	such sums as may be necessary for fiscal years 2016
7	through 2021.
8	"(b) Allotment of Appropriated Funds.—
9	"(1) From amounts made available for each fis-
20	cal year under subsection 1002(b) that are equal to
21	or less than the amount described in section
22	1111(b)(2)(H), the Secretary shall—
23	"(A) reserve ½ of 1 percent for the Bu-
24	reau of Indian Education;

1	"(B) reserve $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1 percent for the out-
2	lying areas;
3	"(C) reserve not more than 20 percent to
4	carry out section 1203; and
5	"(D) from the remainder, allocate to each
6	State for section 1201 an amount equal to—
7	"(i) \$3,000,000; and
8	"(ii) with respect to any amounts re-
9	maining after the allocation is made under
10	subparagraph (A), an amount that bears
11	the same relationship to such total remain-
12	ing amounts as the number of students
13	aged 5 through 17 in the State (as deter-
14	mined by the Secretary on the basis of the
15	most recent satisfactory data) bears to the
16	total number of such students in all States.
17	"(2) Remainder.—Any amounts remaining for
18	a fiscal year after the Secretary carries out para-
19	graph (1) shall be made available as follows:
20	"(A)(i) To award funds under section 1202
21	to States selected for such grants, according to
22	the quality, needs, and scope of the State appli-
23	cation under that section.
24	"(ii) In determining the grant amount
25	under clause (i), the Secretary shall ensure that

1 a State's grant shall include an amount that 2 bears the same relationship to the total funds 3 available under this paragraph for the fiscal 4 year as the number of students ages 5 through 5 17 in the State (as determined by the Secretary 6 on the basis of the most recent satisfactory 7 data) bears to the total number of such stu-8 dents in all States. 9 "(B) Any amounts remaining after the 10 Secretary awards funds under subparagraph 11 (A) shall be allocated to each State that did not 12 receive a grant under such subparagraph, in an 13 amount that bears the same relationship to the 14 total funds available under this subparagraph 15 as the number of students ages 5 through 17 16 in the State (as determined by the Secretary on 17 the basis of the most recent satisfactory data) 18 bears to the total number of such students in 19 all States. 20 "(c) STATE DEFINED.—In this section, the term 'State' means each of the 50 States, the District of Colum-

bia, and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.
