Dear Chairman Collins and Ranking Member Reed:

We are writing to request that funding at the authorized level for the Maritime Security Program (MSP) be included in the Fiscal Year 2018 Departments of Transportation, Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies Appropriations Bill.

MSP is a vital component of our military strategic sealift and global response capability. It is designed to ensure that the United States has the U.S.-flag commercial sealift capability and trained U.S. citizen merchant mariners available in times of war or national emergencies. MSP also ensures that the United States can provide our troops overseas with the supplies and equipment necessary to do their jobs on behalf of our nation.

MSP is a cost-effective, public-private partnership between the U.S. government and the U.S.-flag shipping industry. The program utilizes existing U.S. maritime private sector capabilities at a fraction of the cost of what it would take the federal government. MSP contractors, who continuously develop and maintain modern logistics systems, are able provide enhanced vessel capacity and global intermodal transportation systems to the Department of Defense. The cost to the federal government of replicating the vessels and intermodal system is estimated at least \$65 billion.

Without a viable U.S.-flag commercial fleet and the American merchant mariners this fleet supports, the United States would be unable to deploy its military forces on a global basis and to deliver the supplies and equipment American troops need to do their job on behalf of the American people. In November 2015, Rear Admiral Thomas Shannon, Commander of the Military Sealift Command, stated that "without a strong U.S.-flagged merchant marine, we cannot answer the call and carry our nation to war."

We ask that you continue to support this highly efficient and low-cost public-private partnership as you consider funding levels for FY2018 in your subcommittee's appropriations bill.
