Dear Chairman Shelby, Chairman Blunt, Ranking Member Shaheen and Ranking Member Murray:

Thank you for your continued commitment to funding critical and life-saving programs for victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking. As the Commerce, Justice, Science and the Labor, Health and Human Services Subcommittees consider their Fiscal Year 2018 priorities, we urge you to fund the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) at the highest possible levels.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimate that domestic violence affects more than 12 million people in our nation each year. Congress made clear its commitment to meet the needs of victims of domestic and sexual violence with the passage of the bipartisan Leahy-Crapo Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2013. The programs reauthorized under that law have been vital in providing national resources for legal advocacy and counseling for victims in the aftermath of abuse. Its programs have also provided training and educational sessions for parents, teachers, law enforcement, and other professionals to prevent, identify, and respond to domestic and sexual violence.

Despite these successes, there is great unmet need due to a lack of resources. The National Alliance to End Sexual Violence estimates that over half of rape crisis centers have a waiting list for victims seeking counseling services. The organization also found that in just one day last September, while approximately

73,000 victims of domestic violence received services, another 12,000 requests from victims for services went unmet due to a lack of funding.

We recognize the budgetary constraints you face, but we urge you to support funding for VAWA programs that are not only life-saving, but also cost-saving. Since its enactment, VAWA has saved taxpayers well over \$12 billion in net averted societal costs.

Thank you again for your past support for victims of domestic and sexual violence with annual appropriations. We urge the Subcommittees to support the highest possible funding levels for these crucial and cost-effective programs administered by the Office on Violence Against Women and the Department of Health and Human Services.


