RESOLUTION

To establish a special committee of the Senate to address sexual abuse within United States Olympic Gymnastics.

- 1 Resolved,
- 2 SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE.
- 3 (a) Establishment.—There is established a special
- 4 committee of the Senate to be known as the Special Com-
- 5 mittee to Investigate Sexual Abuse Within United States
- 6 Olympic Gymnastics (hereafter in this resolution referred
- 7 to as the "special committee").
- 8 (b) Purpose.—The purpose of the special committee
- 9 is—

1	(1) to investigate the United States Olympic
2	Committee and national sports governing bodies, in-
3	cluding USA Gymnastics, and determine the extent
4	to which these organizations were complicit in the
5	criminal or negligent behavior of their employees re-
6	lating to sexual abuse;
7	(2) to identify and recommend solutions to the
8	systemic failures at the United States Olympic Com-
9	mittee and national sports governing bodies, includ-
10	ing USA Gymnastics, that allowed for pervasive sex-
11	ual abuse to continue for decades;
12	(3) to identify actions that must be taken by
13	the United States Olympic Committee and national
14	sports governing bodies, including USA Gymnastics,
15	to ensure increased transparency and protections for
16	children, athletes, and their families;
17	(4) to make such findings of fact as are war-
18	ranted and appropriate; and
19	(5) to make such recommendations, including
20	recommendations for new legislation and amend-
21	ments to existing laws and any administrative or
22	other actions, as the special committee may deter-
23	mine to be necessary or desirable.
24	(e) Limitation.—No proposed legislation shall be re-
25	ferred to the special committee, and the special committee

1	shall not have power to report by bill or otherwise have
2	legislative jurisdiction.
3	(d) Treatment as Standing Committee.—For
4	purposes of paragraphs 1, 2, $7(a)(1)$, $7(a)(2)$, and $10(a)$
5	of rule XXVI and rule XXVII of the Standing Rules of
6	the Senate, and subsections (i) and (j) of section 202 of
7	the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C.
8	4301), the special committee shall be treated as a standing
9	committee of the Senate.
10	SEC. 2. MEMBERSHIP AND ORGANIZATION OF THE SPECIAL
11	COMMITTEE.
12	(a) Membership.—
13	(1) In general.—The special committee shall
14	consist of 8 members of the Senate, of whom—
15	(A) 4 shall be appointed by the President
16	pro tempore of the Senate from the majority
17	party of the Senate upon the recommendation
18	of the Majority Leader of the Senate; and
19	(B) 4 shall be appointed by the President
20	pro tempore of the Senate from the minority
21	party of the Senate upon the recommendation
22	of the Minority Leader of the Senate.
23	(2) Composition.—Not less than 4 of the
24	members appointed under paragraph (1) shall be
25	women.

1	(3) Vacancies.—Any vacancy in the member-
2	ship of the special committee shall—
3	(A) not affect the authority of the remain-
4	ing members to execute the functions of the
5	special committee; and
6	(B) be filled in the same manner as origi-
7	nal appointments to the special committee are
8	made.
9	(4) Service.—For the purpose of paragraph 4
10	of rule XXV of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
11	service of a Senator as a member, chair, or vice
12	chair of the special committee shall not be taken
13	into account.
14	(b) Chair and Vice Chair.—
15	(1) In General.—The chair of the special
16	committee shall be selected by the Majority Leader
17	of the Senate and the vice chair of the special com-
18	mittee shall be selected by the Minority Leader of
19	the Senate.
20	(2) VICE CHAIR DUTIES.—The vice chair shall
20 21	(2) VICE CHAIR DUTIES.—The vice chair shall discharge such responsibilities as the special com-
21	discharge such responsibilities as the special com-
21 22	discharge such responsibilities as the special committee or the chair may assign.

1	(1) make expenditures from the contingent fund
2	of the Senate;
3	(2) employ personnel;
4	(3) hold hearings;
5	(4) sit and act at any time or place during the
6	sessions, recesses, and adjourned periods of the Sen-
7	ate;
8	(5) require, by subpoena or otherwise, the at-
9	tendance of witnesses and the production of cor-
10	respondence, books, papers, and documents;
11	(6) take depositions and other testimony;
12	(7) issue interim reports, as necessary;
13	(8) procure the services of individual consulta-
14	tions or organizations thereof in accordance with the
15	provisions of section 202(i) of the Legislative Reor-
16	ganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 4301(i)); and
17	(9) with the prior consent of the Federal de-
18	partment or agency concerned and the Committee on
19	Rules and Administration, use on a nonreimbursable
20	basis the services of personnel of the Federal depart-
21	ment or agency.
22	(b) Oaths for Witnesses.—The chair or any mem-
23	ber of the special committee may administer oaths to wit-
24	nesses.

1	(c) SUBPOENAS.—A subpoena authorized by the spe-
2	cial committee may be—
3	(1) issued over the signature of—
4	(A) the chair after consultation with the
5	vice chair; or
6	(B) any member of the special committee
7	designated by the chair after consultation with
8	the vice chair; and
9	(2) served by any person designated by the
10	chair or the member signing the subpoena.
11	(d) Access of Members to Information.—Each
12	member of the special committee shall have equal and
13	unimpeded access to information collected or otherwise ob-
14	tained by the special committee.
15	SEC. 4. REPORT AND TERMINATION.
16	(a) Report.—The special committee shall report the
17	findings of the special committee, together with such rec-
18	ommendations as the special committee deems advisable,
19	to the Senate not later than the last day of the first ses-
20	sion of the 116th Congress.
21	(b) Records.—Upon termination of the special com-
22	mittee, all records, files, documents, and other materials
23	in the possession, custody, or control of the special com-
24	mittee shall be transferred to the Secretary of the Senate
25	under appropriate conditions established by the special

- 1 committee, including conditions to protect information
- 2 under the HIPAA privacy and security law, as defined in
- 3 section 3009(a) of the Public Health Service Act (42
- 4 U.S.C. 300jj-19(a)).
- 5 SEC. 5. FUNDING.
- 6 From the date on which this resolution is agreed to
- 7 through the termination of the special committee, the spe-
- 8 cial committee shall use such funds as necessary to carry
- 9 out the duties of the special committee.
